





CORPORATE CHARCHA







The guest lecture committee at SCIT organized the fourth edition of Corporate Charcha on 19th August 2023. The theme for this year was "Connectopia - G20's Digital Renaissance", connecting digital infrastructure, Startups, Sustainability, and cyber governance in alignment with G20 regulations. Commencement of the event happened with the Diya lighting in the presence of Director Dr. Dhanya Pramod and dignitary speakers.

The first panelist was Ms. Archana Joshi, an IT Strategy and IT Sustainability Leader and founder of EcoITCon with an overall 22+ years of experience. She talked about the absolute need for a Digital personal data protection bill (DPDP) in India as data is the new oil, and every company's priority is to protect its data first. She added that the bill's greatness should not just be on paper but should translated and should get its due and that software sustainability is the most neglected aspect.

The second panelist was Mr. Rajeev John, an SIBM Pune Alumni with over two decades of experience in IT strategy and enterprise architecture. He talked about the cloud playing a major role in attack prevention, the Gartner hype cycle, and the enforcement of the DPDP being significant. The third panelist was Mr. Nikhil Mahadeshwar, a Certified Security Analyst, Computer Hacking Forensics Investigator, and ISO 27001:2013 Information Security Management Systems Lead Auditor. He talked about how growing cybercrime is based on three things: need, greed, and lust, and the need for India to be digitally secured India and not just digital India. The fourth panelist was Mr. Aakash Ahuja, founder of @itmtb Technologies, a cloud and software engineering company. His designs enabled a global bank to recover from total failure in under three hours. He talked about having the right mindset and passion to sustain yourself by citing an example of rubber meet the road, managing unit economics, and shrewd cash flow management. The moderator of the Charcha, Anzar Malik, did commendable work, and it was an insightful and enriching experience for all the students.

ISACA Pune Chapter



The Annual ITS 2023 conference was conducted by the ISACA Pune Chapter on August 27, 2023, in the Sheraton Grand Hotel, Pune. This year's conference's theme was "Digital Trust: The evolving belief system."

ISACA has lined up thought leaders in Digital Trust across the globe who spoke at the conference. The registration for the same started at 8:00 AM. Soon after the roster, there was breakfast for the attendees, and at 9:15 AM, the opening ceremony began.

The discussion around the central theme of Digital Trust: The evolving belief system started with a welcome address by Rajesh Chaudhari, ISACA Pune chapter President. The discussion included transitioning to automated governance, decoding enterprise cyber defence, using AI/ML in cyberspace, the Digital Personal Data Protection Act, and using blockchain to establish digital trust.

Archives from the Past

Cloud Security





In December we had a charming session on Cloud Security to beat the Monday blues. It was spearheaded by Mr. Manas Pradhan. Manas is a proven technical leader with 15 years of experience applying technology to drive businesses.

The session started rolling on when Manas emphasized that cloud security is a shared responsibility of both Cloud Provider and Customer. He explained Cloud Security with 4 Scenarios. In the first scenario, he explained how the on-premise is migrated into the cloud. He delineated the security group, subnet configuration, NACL and internet gateway. In the next scene, have described the connection to cloud services by using VPC Endpoints. Then, he explained about securing a load balancer. Horizontal scaling refers to adding more instances rather than moving to a larger instance size. Vertical scaling is the addition of faster CPUs, memory, or resources to an existing server or the replacement of one server with a more powerful server. This is governed by the load balancer which distributes the traffic in the cloud.

In the last scenario, we were introduced to CloudFront which is a casting system that shifts on a regional basis and it will handle user traffic globally. We were made aware of securing the CloudFront. Disabling root SSH, password-based authentication, and serial port when not required will secure Virtual machines. Configuring non-root users in Docker image, making the root file system read-only and enforcing network policy will seal Containers. Both Data at rest and Transit have to be monitored carefully. Encryption should be employed on Data at Rest as well as Data at Transit. Sniffers should have to be used to monitor moving data. Access control mechanism should be intact for Stagnant data. Many thought-provoking questions such as industry readiness of cloud, confidential computing were posed in the Q&A session. In Summary, it was an overarching session that laid the cornerstone for cloud security to students.

Building a Career in Cyber Security



A guest lecture was organized on 12th FEBRUARY 2022 on the topic 'Building a successful career in cyber security – Prospects for a rocking career'. The speaker for the guest lecture was Dr. Ram Kumar G, Cyber Security and Risk Leader, Global Automotive Major. The agenda for the guest lecture was understanding the importance of cyber security, at-risk emerging technologies, why cyber security careers, cyber security domains, career paths, security certifications, CISO Mind map, skills shortage and providing some career advice.

The speaker started the guest lecture by discussing the importance of upgrading oneself and how cyber security is part of everything we do. The speaker also discussed the emerging technologies in 2021 which are Blockchain technology, Internet of Things, Artificial Intelligence and Cybersecurity. The speaker also discussed how IoT, Blockchain, AI and Cybersecurity (IBAC) will revolutionize business. The speaker also discussed the 10 Reasons why one should consider Cyber Security as a career. Great insights were provided on Cyber Security Certifications by the speaker and its importance.

Dr. Ram Kumar discussed the 15 most valuable certifications in 2021 as well as top 10 best IT Certifications for high paying jobs in 2022. He also discussed the data privacy certifications that add a lot of value. The speaker also said that 'Only cyber security jobs at IT firms are Covid-19 virus-proof '. The speaker also discussed the job opportunities in cyber security and discussed the Information Security industry scape as well as market map. The speaker also discussed other unconventional cyber security careers. Dr. Ram Kumar provided insights about the career milestones. The speaker ended the session by sharing a few amazing lines which was that "The illiterate of the 21st century will not be those who cannot read and write, but those who cannot learn, unlearn, and relearn" by Alvin Toffler. The guest lecture provided great insights about the career in cyber security and was highly appreciated.


